

1. Children and Youth Sexual Abuse Intervention Counsellor/ Children and Youth Group Facilitator (\$50,960/yr - \$56,238/yr @ 35hrs/week)

The Sexual Abuse Intervention Counsellor (26.25 hrs/wk) provides assessment, treatment, case management and advocacy services to children who have been sexually abused and their families or caregivers. The Counsellor will help

- alleviate psycho-social impairment and/or trauma-related symptoms in children and youth who have experienced sexual abuse,
- reduce the likelihood of adverse long-term consequences of child sexual abuse trauma (e.g., depression, substance misuse, etc),
- manage or reduce problematic behaviours including inappropriate sexual behaviours
- provide specialized treatment services to children with special needs (e.g., children with disabilities) who have been sexually abused.
- assist non-offending family members and significant others in supporting children/youth who have experienced sexual abuse,
- instil knowledge and skills that reduce the likelihood of future incidents of sexual abuse,
- assist the child and/or caregivers to develop an understanding of healthy sexuality, and
- as resources permit, build capacity to educate the public and the community on the prevention and early detection of child sexual abuse.

As the Child and Youth Group Facilitator (8.75hrs/wk), the successful candidate will facilitate short-term, topic-based groups that

- help children and youth to identify, understand and overcome personal/family problems, strengthen self-esteem, social and academic success at school, and
- provides support for children and youth who have witnessed abuse in the home.

The incumbent will have sound knowledge of normal stages and related aspects of parenting and family life and the effects of childhood trauma, abuse (specifically, sexual abuse) and neglect on general development.

This position requires a Master's Degree in Counselling or relevant field and 2 years recent related experience.

The successful candidates will possess good working knowledge of Aboriginal issues, providing services in a cultural safe manner and commitment to a client-centered approach. An acceptable combination of education and training will be considered.

A valid driver's license and own vehicle, as well as a successful completion of a criminal record check are required. Winter tires are required October 1 – March 31. As a member of our team you will receive an excellent benefits package and work in a supportive, flexible environment.
